Employment Requirements:

- Based on the funding requirements for this position, applicants must be youth aged 15-29 years and a Manitoba resident who is legally entitled to work in Canada.
- We are looking for 1 term position in Brandon, Manitoba and 3 term positions in Winnipeg, Manitoba.
- 35 hours per week from July 2, 2024 to September 30, 2024 per Community Development Coordinator postion.

Core Accountabilities and Responsibilities:

- Promote and facilitate the expansion of preschool, youth and adult sport programs within the community.
- Support the Director of Program Development with facility scheduling, program confirmation and facility set-up plans.
- Monitors and maintains inventory of program equipment and supplies, sources, and purchases when required.
- Responds to telephone enquires/e-mails, troubleshoots and problem-solves issues.
- Assists with registration questions, customer service and waitlist management.
- Assists in overseeing day-to-day operation of sport programs.
- Promote and facilitate one Heathy Athlete workshop promoting nutrition, hydration and exercise to Special Olympics Manitoba athletes.
- Maintain accurate data for the annual census, including participation in programs, events, and courses.



- Recruit and train new volunteers for community sport and school programs.
- Travel throughout the regions as required, fulfilling the commitments of the position.
- Establish and adhere to project budgets and timelines.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

- Experience in coaching, volunteer, program, and/or community development.
- Experience working with people with an intellectual disability would be an asset.
- Ability to work in cross-cultural teams with respect for diversity.

- Must be able to provide a clear criminal record.
